

Assistant/Associate Professor - Environmental & Occupational Health

The Department of Environmental and Occupational Health in the Colorado School of Public Health (CSPH) invites applications for a tenure-track position at the Assistant or Associate Professor level. We seek candidates with expertise in one or more areas of environmental or occupational epidemiology.

We encourage applicants with interests that address cross-disciplinary research in respiratory health, spatial modeling, built environment, gene-environment interactions, cancer, or exposure science, but all areas of occupational or environmental epidemiology will be considered if a strong research and teaching mission is articulated. These positions require a rigorous program of independent research along with teaching at the graduate level.

The Department of Environmental and Occupational Health is young, growing and seeks a multi-disciplinary faculty to expand our cutting edge research into new areas. The department has new laboratory space as well as research and education initiatives in the areas of air pollution and respiratory health, children's environmental health, built environment, occupational health and safety, bio monitoring, and the impact of energy development on workers and communities. The Department houses training programs in Occupational Medicine and the NIOSH funded Mountains and Plains Education and Research Center. Faculty affiliates include scientists from Colorado State University, UC-Boulder, National Jewish Health and several of the federal agencies that have their western headquarters in Denver.

The Colorado School of Public Health is the first and only accredited school of public health in the rocky mountain region. Collaboratively formed by the University of Colorado Denver, Colorado State University, and the University of Northern Colorado, CSPH provides training, innovative research and community service to actively address public health issues, including chronic disease, access to health care, environmental threats, emerging infectious diseases, and costly injuries. This position will have a primary faculty appointment at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus. The 227 acre health sciences campus is recently built and includes two hospitals and over 5 million square feet of research, educational and clinical space. - a) A PhD, ScD, DrPH or MD with additional research training in environmental and occupational epidemiology or allied fields.

- b) Research experience in environmental or occupational health.

At the Assistant Professor level:

Demonstrated potential to establish an independent program of research.

At the Associate Professor level:

An established independent program of research.
