

Assistant/Associate Professor

The University of Texas School of Public (UTSPH) Health San Antonio Regional Campus invites applications from outstanding candidates for four full-time 12-month tenure-track assistant or associate professor positions. Successful applicants will have earned a terminal degree (PhD, DrPH, or MD preferred), have demonstrated capability or substantial promise to secure and conduct competitive externally-funded research, publish in peer-reviewed publications, and will be able to collaborate with multidisciplinary research teams and participate in professional service. Teaching experience in her or his discipline at the graduate level and commitment to excellence in advising graduate students are desirable.

Applicants are sought in the following public health disciplines:

Health Services Research: two positions that are joint appointments with the recently-established ReACH Center (Research to Advance Community Health) that represents a collaboration of the UTSPH, the UT Health Science Center in San Antonio and the University Health System. ReACH offers a unique research environment for individuals with a track record of funded research in topics related to health disparities, health care economics, comparative effectiveness, and medical informatics.

Epidemiology: one position for a candidate with formal training in epidemiology (PhD or MD), and experience in conducting collaborative epidemiologic research. Epidemiologists in all areas are encouraged to apply, but preference will be given to candidates with documented expertise in cancer, diabetes, cardiovascular disease, or trauma and injury.

Community Health Practice: one position for a candidate with experience in health program planning and evaluation, management and leadership, community-based participatory research, community assessment, or health policy. There are many collaborative opportunities to respond to public health demands and assist our community in examining and identifying health problems, as well as providing assistance in implementing solutions to enhance disease prevention activities in South Texas.

The UTSPH (www.sph.uth.tmc.edu) is a dynamic, top-tier school that is transforming public health locally, nationally, and internationally. The UTSPH has 165 faculty members and 1400 students at the main Houston campus and five regional campuses across Texas. The San Antonio Regional Campus (SARC) embraces a mission to be a research, teaching and service partner within the UTSPH network and in the growing, vibrant, and culturally rich San Antonio and South Texas region. The highly-subscribed and successful MD/MPH dual degree with the UT Health Science Center at San Antonio (UTHSCSA) School of Medicine is an innovative four-year program now in replication across Texas. SARC is strategically co-located with UTHSCSA and the South Texas Medical Center and enjoys strong collaborative relationships with UT-San Antonio, local military installations, and an array of public and private health and human service agencies throughout the region.

Application reviews will continue until the positions are filled. Interested applicants should email a letter describing his/her qualifications and interests, attaching a curriculum vitae and contact information for three professional references.
