

Assistant Professor - Epidemiology

**University of Texas School of Public Health
San Antonio, Texas**

The University of Texas School of Public Health (UTSPH) invites applications for a tenure-track faculty position in epidemiology at the assistant professor level, with special interest in those who have documented expertise in cancer epidemiology. This position is with the San Antonio Regional Campus, one of five UTSPH regional campuses that, along with its home institution in Houston, comprise a statewide network. All of the campuses are linked electronically, which facilitates communication, expanded course offerings, and research collaborations. The UTSPH has 150 faculty, 1400 students, and an extensive and diverse teaching and research program. (See website at www.sph.uth.tmc.edu.)

The ongoing population-based research activities at the UTSPH and The University of Texas Health Science Center San Antonio provide considerable and exciting opportunities for etiological studies. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to collaborate closely with the Cancer Therapy Research Center, one of four National Cancer Institute (NCI)-designated Cancer Centers in Texas and the only NCI-designated center in South Texas, serving a region of 4 million people and including a large, multiethnic population. In addition, Texas is unique in having a state-funded Cancer Prevention Research Institute of Texas (CPRIT) that has committed \$3 billion over 10 years to cancer research restricted to researchers from Texas institutions. The San Antonio Regional Campus offers both masters and doctoral degrees in epidemiology. The campus is strategically located in the vibrant city of San Antonio, in South Central Texas, with a mission to be a research, teaching and service partner within the UTSPH network of campuses, as well as with The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, The University of Texas at San Antonio, and the Regional and Metropolitan Public Health agencies in San Antonio. This campus has been established since 1979 and has produced more than 700 graduates. The San Antonio Regional Campus also has a highly subscribed MD/MPH program with The University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio School of Medicine.

Qualifications include: (1) an earned doctoral degree in epidemiology or relevant field; (2) a commitment to excellence in teaching and advising graduate students; and (3) a track record and/or strong promise of obtaining peer-reviewed funding and publications in the area of cancer epidemiology. The selected candidate will serve as principal investigator on externally-funded projects and as co-investigator with multi-disciplinary research teams, and contribute to the educational mission through teaching and advising graduate students. Investigators with a track record of extramural funding will be given preference.

Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. Candidates should e-mail a letter describing their qualifications and interests along with their curriculum vitae, and contact information for three professional references.

The University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston is an EO/AA employer. M/F/D/V. Minorities and women are strongly encouraged to apply. This is a security-sensitive position and thereby subject to Texas Education code 51.215. A background check will be required for the final candidates.
