

Assistant/Associate/Full Professor – Environmental Health

**Rollins School of Public Health of Emory University

The Department of Environmental Health at the Rollins School of Public Health of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia (www.sph.emory.edu/eoh) is continuing a major faculty expansion in 2011. The Department has hired six tenure-track faculty over the past three years, and seeks additional scholars for appointments at all academic ranks and in all areas of environmental health, with particular emphasis on global environmental health (including climate change, water and sanitation), risk assessment (including comparative risk assessment, global burden of disease), environmental biostatistics and modeling (including geospatial analysis, PBPK modeling), gene-environment interactions and epigenetics, toxicology (including computational toxicology) and environmental health policy (including health economics). Candidates for senior positions should have excellent training; a strong record of research and teaching, particularly at the graduate level; a demonstrated capacity to secure external funding; and an established research program. Candidates for junior tenure-track positions must demonstrate the potential to become independent investigators and graduate-level teachers. Non-tenure track research faculty positions are also available.

The Department of Environmental Health consists of 19 primary faculty with an additional 11 joint faculty members holding primary appointments in other departments (e.g., Epidemiology, Global Health, Medicine) and over 40 adjunct faculty, many affiliated with the neighboring Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The Department has achieved national recognition for research programs in the areas of environmental epidemiology, neurotoxicology, infectious disease ecology, exposure assessment and risk analysis; the faculty have particular strength in pesticide, air pollutant and waterborne exposures. Multiple opportunities for interdisciplinary collaboration in environmental health exist with other academic departments and with nearby institutions, including the CDC and Georgia Tech.

The Rollins School of Public Health, founded in 1990, has rapidly emerged as one of the nation's leading schools of public health and currently enrolls over 1000 students in its graduate programs. A second School of Public Health building with state-of-the-art laboratory facilities was completed in 2010, and houses our department.
